Hiring Trends in Philippines

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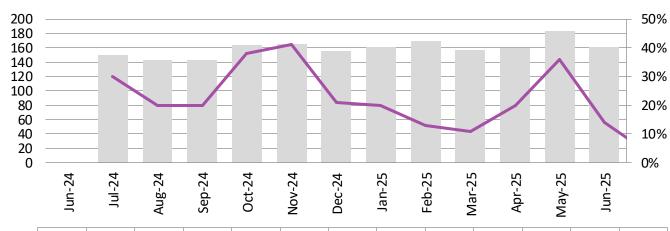
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Key Highlights of the Month

Philippines saw a 3% growth in employment activity in July 2025

- Recruitment activity in July 2025 rose to 154 on the foundit Insights Tracker (fit), up from 149 a year earlier marking a 3% year-on-year increase. While the pace of growth was more modest compared to previous months, the upward trend underscores the job market's steady momentum amid evolving business needs and workforce dynamics.
- Hiring activity eased in July 2025, with the index falling to 154 from 160 in June marking a 4% month-on-month decline. This slowdown reflects seasonal or tactical hiring adjustments
- Over the past three months, hiring in the Philippines fell 16%, with a six-month decline of 9%. The slowdown reflects seasonal and tactical hiring adjustments, as employers recalibrate after earlier recruitment surges. While sectors like technology, ecommerce, and healthcare remain resilient, others are prioritising efficiency over expansion—signalling a measured, opportunity-driven approach to talent acquisition.

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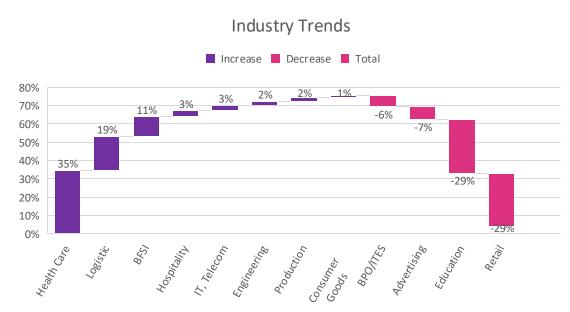

Hiring Trends – Industry*

Hiring gained momentum annually in 8 of the 12 monitored industries in the month of July'25

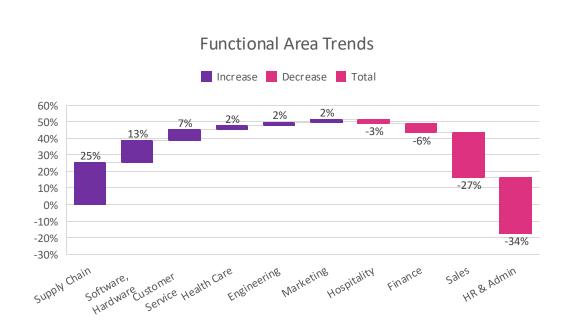
- Healthcare hiring in the Philippines grew 35% year-on-year, driven by sustained investment in medical infrastructure, expansion of hospital networks, and rising demand for specialised care professionals. Logistics and shipping followed with 19% growth, supported by e-commerce expansion, increasing cross-border trade, and investment in port and warehousing capabilities. BFSI posted an 11% increase, fuelled by rapid fintech adoption, digital transformation initiatives, and a growing customer base seeking modern banking and insurance solutions.
- Both the **Retail** (-29%) and **Education** (-29%) sectors in the Philippines witnessed a notable year-on-year drop in hiring, pointing to a shared trend, the impact of digital disruption and ongoing operational realignment.
- Other sectors that posted year-on-year growth in hiring activity include Hospitality (+3%), IT and Telecom/ISP (+3%), Engineering, Construction, and Real Estate (+2%), Production/Manufacturing, Automotive, and Ancillary (+2%), and Consumer Goods/FMCG, Food & Packaged Food, Home Appliance, Garments/Textiles/Leather, Gems & Jewellery (+1%). In contrast, the BPO/ITES sector (-6%) and Advertising, Market Research, Public Relations, Media, and Entertainment (-7%) recorded notable annual declines, reflecting cautious employer sentiment in these segments.



Hiring Trends - Functional Area*

Hiring activity exceeded year-ago levels in 6 out of 10 functional areas observed by the tracker

- With Purchase/Logistics/Supply Chain growing at 25%, fuelled by the rapid expansion of e-commerce, last-mile delivery networks, and regional supply chain re-shoring that has boosted demand for procurement, warehousing, and transport talent. Software/Hardware/Telecom roles follow with 13% growth, supported by continued investment in cloud, cybersecurity, and digital infrastructure within the ICT and IT-BPM sectors, though growth is concentrated in high-value skills. Customer Service ranks third at 7% growth, reflecting the Philippines' BPO strength employing nearly 1.8 million people but moderating as automation reshapes routine work and shifts demand toward specialised, tech-enabled support services.
- Conversely, hiring for HR & Admin (-34%) and Sales & Business Development (-27%) roles in the Philippines saw a year-on-year decline as businesses are redefining support and client-facing roles focusing more on specialised skills, performance-driven structures, and cost-effective staffing to drive long-term value.
- Sectors showing positive growth include **Health Care**, **Engineering/Production and Real Estate**, and **Marketing & Communications**, each at **2%**. Those experiencing a decline are **Hospitality & Travel** at **-3%** and **Finance & Accounts** at **-6%**.



Data & Methodology

The foundit Insights Tracker (fit) is a comprehensive monthly analysis of online job posting activity conducted by foundit.in. Based on a real-time review of millions of employer job opportunities culled from a large, representative selection of online career outlets, fit presents a snapshot of employer online recruitment activity nationwide. In its earlier form (as Monster Employment Index), it gave a broader view of hiring trends by industry, function, location and experience levels. In its new avatar, it provides next-level insights on recruitment trends and tracks developments in demand for key skills, roles available and salary range on offer in the market.

In order to avoid excessive monthly fluctuations, the index is calculated using a volatility-adjusting formula. We publish the data in a volume index format with the base value of 100. The index describes changes in the level of online job demand against the baseline. An increase in the index indicates growth in online job availability and suggests an increase in the demand for employees by employers.

foundit Insights Tracker (formerly Monster Employment Index) was first launched in India in May 2010 with data collected since November 2009 followed by Gulf in April 2011 with data collected since November 2010; Singapore in May 2014 with data collected since February 2011; Philippines and Malaysia in May 2015 with data collected since February 2014.
